

The school accreditation standards and Act 35 of the State of AR require the districts report their status of academic performance to the public annually.





LMS Schoolwide Literacy Focus

All teachers are involved in literacy instruction during our flexible 30-minute RtI period three times per week (with the exception of three math and one science teacher). Literacy teachers are instrumental in assisting other teachers in this endeavor by providing resources and strategies. IReady materials are being used for this purpose as well. Students grouped based on deficit skills as outlined by initial iReady assessment.



Our literacy team presented to our staff during preschool inservice the literacy strategy, Annotation Marks, which encompassed the definition for close reading and annotating and annotating symbols, along with modeling the close reading process. Teachers were provided time to practice and reflect with the assistance of the literacy team. This strategy is being utilized in all classrooms.

Along with following the literacy protocol, literacy teachers are incorporating morphology/word study into their instruction three days per week.

Student Focus - Positive Relationships

Advisory - 15 minutes daily

Monday - K2K (Knee to Knee) meet individually with students regarding grades, etc.

Wednesday - Cool Tools (Choose Love) and One Book One School, currently, "Fish in a Tree"

TMM - Ten-Minute Mentor

Integrity Cards - Behavior based, determined by students - Gold, Sliver, Bronze

Lunch Bunch - sharing lunch one day/week

Rabs Room - Incentive

Enrichment - student choice for activities, two days/week

Counselor - provides conflict resolution with small groups and classrooms




2018-2019 Revenue

Facilities

Lonoke High School

- Demolition of South Annex (completed Sept. 2019)
- LED Lighting completed around the LHS and in front of the Gina Cox
- Agri A/C and Heater Upgrade
- Parking lot striping has begun
- Flowerbeds in front of LHS and GCC complete

Admin Office

- LED conversion is almost complete
- Parking lot striping to begin soon
- Flowerbeds complete





Facilities

Middle School

- Parking lot poles all have been converted to LED
- Wall pack lights have been converted to LED
- Gym lights were fixed over the summer
- Safe Room lights fixed over the summer
- Replaced over 400 lights inside

Elementary

- LED conversion is hallways and office area. Cafe' will be complete on the 21st of Oct. Classrooms will be finished this summer
